

STEELE INDUCTED INTO ALABAMA BUILDING INDUSTRY HALL OF FAME

Montgomery— Steve Steele of Huntsville has been inducted into the Alabama Building Industry Hall of Fame, the highest honor presented by the Home Builders Association of Alabama (HBAA). The induction ceremony took place during the HBAA's Annual Convention awards banquet on Friday, October 27, 2017 at the Henderson Beach Resort in Destin, Florida.

Steele, the owner of Steve Steele Custom Homes, has been a member of the Huntsville/Madison County Builders Association since 1986 and has served on its Board of Directors since 1994. He has served on nearly every association committee, most notably the Membership Committee, which he chaired in 2000 and 2001. He served as the Showcase Home Construction Manager in 1997 and in 1998 served as the HMCBA President.

At the state level, he has served as HBAA Membership Chair, Affordable Housing Council Chair, Land Developers Chair and Secretary of the HBAA Remodelers. In 2011 he served as HBAA President.

Steele's commitment to the building industry has earned him several awards, including being named the Jerry L. Siniard Builder of the Year by the HCMBA in 1998, the HBAA's Shannon B. Lowder Builder of the Year in 2006 and the HBAA Remodeler of the Year in 2012. He was inducted into the HMCBA's Hall of Fame in 2006.
